  - (D) Where a customer is so located that it is necessary to use private right-of-way to furnish a service or channels and the Utility is unable to obtain the required right-of-way without cost, the customer may be required to pay the entire costs involved in securing and retaining such right-of-way.<sup>1</sup>
  - (E) When attachments are made to poles of other companies, the additional cost to the Utility of such attachments is borne by the customer.
  - (F) Title to all construction provided wholly or partly at a customer's expense is vested in the Utility.
  - (G) Construction charges are payable at the time application for service is signed or when the account is rendered, at the option of the Utility.
  - (H) When circuitous routing or a type of construction not ordinarily required is provided at the customer's request, in cases where facilities would ordinarily be provided without construction charge to the customer, the excess cost of the construction is borne by the customer.<sup>1</sup>
