Applicable to special assemblies of equipment to meet special requirements.

- B. REGULATIONS
 - When a customer is furnished special equipment for which provision is not otherwise made, an installation charge and monthly rate and where applicable, a basic termination charge will be incurred based upon the total cost of the equipment furnished or of the special work required, subject to the review of such charges by the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
 - a. General
 - Rules of the Utility applicable to services with which special assemblies of equipment are associated also apply to the special assemblies of equipment.
 - (2) Unless otherwise specified, the rates and regulations for special equipment furnished in this schedule, are in addition to the rates, charges and regulations, applicable to and as filed in other tariff schedules for equipment items with which the special assemblies are associated.
 - b. Basic Termination Charge

A. REGULATIONS

Call detail will be provided on magnetic tape only. Call detail will include the originating Centrex station number or primary Centrex service primary telephone number on calls dialed from a Centrex service over access lines to a CCSA switcher or CCSA-type private network. Under this (T) offering, the duration of the call will be shown in minutes and seconds.

The nonrecurring charges include the cost of magnetic tape on a recovery and reuse basis. That is, tape when processed by the State of California for each Centrex service, will be returned monthly to the Utility in condition suitable for reuse by the Utility in processing subsequent call detail data.

Call detail will be provided on magnetic tape in the code terminology and data processing format used by the Utility. The Utility reserves the right to make changes in its code terminology and data processing format of the information on the magnetic tape upon one month's advance notice to the customer.

The monthly rates were derived from a study of call volumes of estimated average usage based on data for each of the State of California #1ESS Centrex services with access lines to a CCSA switcher. These monthly rates shall be subject to periodic review and may be adjusted when the average usage arrived at is greater or less than such average by 20%. Such adjusted rates, when mutually agreed upon between the Utility and the State of California will become effective as and when authorized by the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
